A team of high school students from Ecole Mark R. Isfeld Secondary School in the Comox Valley will demonstrate their creativity and critical thinking by competing in China's national Destination Imagination championship tournament in Bejing, China in early December. Seven students from grades 10 – 12 will work as a team to solve an extreme challenge sponsored by National Geographic and then have their solution compared with those from other countries around the world.
