She enjoyed everything that life had to offer. Within DI, Kendra dedicated herself to developing out of the box ideas and helping out in every way that she could. Her contributions both her community will remain ingrained in the memories of her teammates and all who knew her.

Besides Destination Imagination, Kendra was active in both the arts and sciences. A talented artist, Kendra developed her love at an early age at Vancouver Academic of Dance and with the University Community Children's Choir. Later she attended Arts Umbrella and dedicated much of her time in the school art studio. Very interested in science, she took part in and won multiple awards in many regional and national science fairs. She also volunteered in a number of community activities including Bard on the Beach and at her schools.

In Kendra's memory, her York House Destination Imagination team wishes to award a \$1,000 scholarship to a student who embodies the spirit of Kendra Fu both in and out of the Destination Imagination program. - Studies/participates in two or more diverse subject areas
- Has given back to the community through volunteering
